
Learning about the Faith of Our Neighbors

Wednesday Evenings at 7:00pm (after Lenten worship) March 12-April 9






We will meet for a reflection/check-intime each week on Sunday evenings on Zoom 7pm, March 9, 16, 23, 30, April 6.
