Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, April 18th 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:06pm. Present were Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Donna Meltz, Shannon Johnson, Don Anderson and Lynn Rochon.

Devotions were given by Lynn. Next month will be Aine.

Greg Kvam was at the meeting to help us understand the financial reports we get. We also went through all the dedicated funds to see which ones we can eliminate since they are no longer used. A motion was made by Donna and seconded by Shannon to remove the dormant and unused accounts. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report: We reviewed the check book register and the budget numbers year-to-date. The check book balance is \$7,968.06, the savings balance is \$15,024.46 and the mortgage is at \$39,614.53. A motion was made by Christel and seconded by Margaret to accept March's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Pastors Report: For the ELCA Youth Gathering, they have \$3,000 to \$4,000 left to raise, depending on final transportation/feed costs. They will continue to sell candy bars, and are looking into a Culver's Share Night and a hot dog/chips sale in the parking lot. They may also do a "Stock Sale" for a final push to complete the fundraising goal. The group will be meeting together monthly beginning in May to prepare with group building activities and bible study. The youth groups from our Saviors in Superior and Trinity in Lake Nebagamon will be joining them at one of the meetings. A new bishop will be elected in June. To learn about the candidates, go to the synod website. Our delegates to the assembly will be voting in the election. Our congregation along with the other 3 ELCA churches in Superior will be receiving a Bright Spot Award at the synod assembly. We are being recognized for our dedication to shared ministry work as we gather for worship together, meet regularly to check in with one another and the work we are doing to support the Afghan refugees. **Discipleship**: LOGOS last night will be May 8th. The bishop was at LOGOS 2 weeks ago. Sunday School ends May 19th.

Worship and Music: no meeting was held this month.

Property: We are checking if the city will allow some of the grant money to be used for other capital projects. The city will look at bids and then will decide if more money can be used. We have gotten quotes for a button to automatically open the main door to the church, another quote for getting siding on the north part of the church and are waiting to get a quote for new flooring in the fellowship hall and hallway in front of the sanctuary. The Property team is also looking at replacing the food shelf cabinet. It is 5 years old and on its last legs. **Stewardship**: They are working on a survey they will put on Facebook. The survey is geared to see why people who engage on social media but do not attend services.

WELCA: The balance in their account is \$1,861.30. They donate \$50 to the general fund and \$50 to the mortgage every month. On May 9th, they will be having lunch at Perkins. All women of Zion are invited. There will be a signup sheet posted. The last meeting before summer break is May 19th. They will help with National Night Out in August. Aine will apply for a grant from Thrivent for that event.

A motion was made by Shannon and seconded by Donna to accept all reports as given. Motion carried. **Unfinished Business**: A special congregational meeting will be Sunday, June 2nd to accept the changes to the constitution. It wasn't held in April because it needs to be in the bulletin. It will be announced at services on May 19th and May 26th. The people who have mailboxes down by the Pastors office will be moved to boxes by the church office. Also, anyone who does not currently have a mailbox will be assigned one. **New Business**: Upcoming important dates are May 19th is graduate recognition and last day of Sunday School, May 23rd is all volunteer appreciation dinner, May 26 is the start of one service at 9:30.

A motion was made at 7:18 by Christel and seconded by Don to adjourn. Motion carried. Submitted by Christel Lewis

Financial Update



Zion's operating budget for 2024 is \$166,795. When we set this budget in January, we knew it would take a community effort to reach this goal as it is an increase from the last couple of years. General mission giving makes up about 72% of our budgeted income and the rest comes from designated giving and fundraising. We had a successful pasty bake this spring and are on track with our fundraising goals. Thank you to all who were able to participate in this shared effort! Designated giving toward our mortgage and other program activities are currently being funded at about 20% for the year, which is a little low, but not too far off expected amounts as of the end of April. That is good news! Our giving tends to ebb and flow through the year, and at this point we are still able to cover our expenses.

As a congregation, we are currently giving at about the same level toward our general mission as last year, but this is not allowing us to keep up with our increased 2024 budgeted expenses, so we have had to use some of our savings to make up this shortfall.

Through the end of April, we are about \$11,300 short of the budgeted goal for general mission giving. This means we will need an additional \$4200 on average each month beyond the current giving level to meet our budgeted expenses by the year-end. A challenging goal, but not impossible!

Generous giving is a faith practice, and one that is not always easy to talk about in our world where we are often so defined by our economic activities. Giving of ourselves and our resources is always an act of faith, an act that deepens our relationship with God and our neighbor. If you are financially able to help with a special gift toward the general mission fund or would like to increase your regular monthly gift, your generosity would be much appreciated in the coming months as we work together to accomplish the goals we set for ministry in 2024. Join Zion's Summer Bible Olympics Challenge




