Pastor's Message



When evening had come, [Jesus said to the disciples,] "Let us go across to the other side." Mark 4:35

This past Sunday in our gospel text from Mark, we heard the story of what happened on their way to the "other side" with Jesus. A great windstorm arose, the water was crashing into the boat, and they seemed to think this was the end. And Jesus was just sleeping through it! So they wake him up saying, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Does he not care that his invitation has turned into something that seems beyond their control and feels like death may be near?

Jesus gives this same invitation to go across to the other side several times in Mark's gospel. In each instance, they are usually leaving behind a crowd of people Jesus has just taught or fed or healed, and then climbing into a

boat to move somewhere new. They are never told the destination, but asked to just trust in the invitation. Twice the invitation leads to them encountering a great storm on the Sea of Galilee...this one where Jesus is asleep in the boat with them, and the second where Jesus comes to them walking on the water. In the storms, they were asked about their lack of faith as disciples and also amazed by the divine nature of Jesus meeting them in their fear. Each time they leave one shore to go to the other side, they encounter someone there who needs healing: the man with the legion of demons, Jairus' daughter, the bleeding woman, and a blind man. It seems that Jesus does not go anywhere without a healing purpose, and he invites the disciples to get in the boat and join him in this work.

As God's people, as disciples of Jesus, I think we are often being called to get in the boat and go to the "other side" too as we participate in the life of the risen Christ now. We are called to move toward places and toward people where Jesus intends for us to go, to participate in his transformative healing work in this world. It may test our faith, but also it may help us recognize the divine presence of Christ with us as we struggle in the movement toward something new, toward healing in us and with our neighbors. May we continually pay attention to Jesus' invitations in our lives and as a church, and be ready to go where Jesus leads us. May these experiences strengthen our faith and make us more aware of the divine presence of Jesus with us through it all. Amen!

Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, May 16th, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:05pm. Present were Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Donna Meltz, Don Anderson and Lynn Rochon.

Devotions were given by Aine. Next month will be Donna.

A motion was made by Aine and seconded by Donna to accept last month's secretary's report. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report: We discussed the balance sheet provided by Greg and discussed the checking account statement. The check book balance is \$7,378.74 and the savings balance is \$10,024.46.

Pastors Report: Pastor is working with Paul on creating an e-newsletter to be sent out weekly, along with the current monthly newsletter. The e-newsletter will have links to our website and Facebook pages. The summer office hours will be 8am - 1pm, Monday through Thursday and the office will be closed on Friday's. Vicky Holm will be working on keeping our food shelf stocked. Her and Pastor will be working on plans to work with community businesses who might be throwing food away that could be used in our food shelf. Pastor will be taking vacation from June 9th through June 15th.

Discipleship: LOGOS ended last week and Sunday School's last week is this Sunday. VBS is scheduled from August $5 - August 8^{th}$. A book study was started and had 15 people participating. The Wednesday Bible study meets until the end of May and then will take the summer off and restart in the fall.

Worship and Music: We will be going to one service on May 26th at 9:30am. They are looking for anyone who would like to play a musical instrument or any other musical talent. There is a baptism on June 2nd.

Property: This committee met on Tuesday night and worked on the grass clumps that were plowed up early this past winter. They are thinking of having a church work party to paint the lower part of the cross out front and stain the deck. Lynn will call Paul Freer about setting up the lawn mowing for this summer.

Stewardship: This committee met earlier tonight. They are going to have a summer kickoff event on Juneteenth, which is Wednesday, June 19th. They will have a campfire, fellowship time and outdoor games along with other things. The event runs from 4pm - 7pm. They setup a survey on Facebook and had 7 responses, mostly from people who already attended services here.

WELCA: The dinner at Perkins was well attended. After the last meeting this Sunday, they will be taking the summer off, although, they will be helping the Nation Night Out event. They donated to the Superior High School's all night grad party. They have \$1,836.13 in their checking account.

A motion was made by Donna and seconded by Christel to accept all reports as given. Motion carried.



Upcoming dates to keep in mind: May 19th is graduate recognition and the last day of Sunday School, May 23rd is All Volunteer Appreciation Dinner and May 26th we start one Sunday service at 9:30am.
