Pastor's Message



Happy September and welcome to fall! We know that there is a rhythm to the life of faith, just as there is a rhythm to our daily lives, and that the two often are related. How we worship or pray or experience God's presence can shift or change at different points in our year, and even in different seasons of our lives, depending on the responsibilities we have and the events that are happening for us at that time. Paying close attention to how these rhythm changes feel in our body and soul is a good spiritual practice. It's good to make time to check-in and evaluate how we experience God's presence, and where God might be drawing us to notice something important.

September is one of my favorite times of the year because the energy I feel at this transition time in the calendar feels like a new box of crayons--full of wonder and possibility for something new and fresh to begin. I get spiritually energized by the start of a new year of learning in Sunday School, Logos youth group and confirmation classes, bible studies, book studies...and even in worship. Perhaps this is true for you too! Fall is a great time to evaluate our rhythm of faith for ourselves and for our families. Where is

God making God's presence known in our lives, what is getting in the way, and how can we feel more connected and nourished in our life of faith?

Sometimes when I ask people how things are going for them, they answer by saying, "Oh, you know...living the dream!" This response always makes me smile along with wondering what exactly that means for them. Mostly, I think this type of response expresses our general human feeling of wanting our life to be more, but being stuck in the daily rut of fulfilling all the general expectations of what our life is supposed to include or be about—the rhythm of going to work or doing our chores, keeping ourselves and family fed, having occasional moments of fun or entertainment, and then hopefully waking up to do it all again the next day.

I think living the dream is actually about the desire to have A GOOD LIFE. I think most human beings want to say we have a good life, that we are blessed or at peace, or simply that we "can't complain" and truly mean it. Sometimes the GOOD LIFE seems unattainable or beyond our ability to make it happen with our current resources. I wonder though what having a good life, or living the dream, really is or really looks like... What does the GOOD LIFE include or not include? Who gets to decide and how does it come about? What if there is more to life than the rhythm that you are stuck in... whatever rhythm that is at the moment?

This fall we are going to talk about A GOOD LIFE in worship beginning on Sept. 8th. We are going to wonder about how we are WALKING WITH JESUS as a daily life rhythm as we learn together in our discipleship activities like Sunday School, Logos youth group, and bible study groups, and more. I hope that you find space this fall to wonder how God is encouraging you to get into a rhythm that helps you find the fullness and radical freedom of the abundant life God wants to give you.
