Pastor's Message



Dear Church, we have been called to a great task in this world, and we get to participate in God's mission and ministry for the sake of the whole world that God deeply loves. We are God's beloved children now, a community of the baptized who are sent out into the world, continually being equipped by the Spirit to follow where love leads us. You and I are called to love one another (and the whole world) with the love that has first been given to us (1 John 4:19, John 15:12).

Love is the very grounding of stewardship, and stewardship is the calling and tangible practices guiding us to use our full lives, everything that we are and that we have, to participate in God's ongoing work of love transforming this world. As a church, we take time each fall to remind ourselves of the grounding we have in our faith to respond with love toward our neighbors. We take time to review how we are doing in using our time, talents, and treasure to more fully participate in God's ongoing work in the world. We look to the future and plan for how we will continue to follow God into the world with the

resources we have been given. So you might hear some things about stewardship in the coming weeks!

The gospel reading for Sunday, October 13th is from Mark 10:17-31, and it includes Jesus telling a rich man that he must sell everything, give the money to the poor, and follow him to inherit eternal life. Jesus also uses the illustration of a camel going through the eye of a needle to describe how difficult it is to fully love and be a disciple when we cling too tightly to our possessions and our own sense of security or control.

Jesus continually speaks about the dangers of money in the gospels and warns us all about our relationship with our possessions. It is easy to dismiss the radical nature of Jesus' teachings because we are thoroughly shaped by our capitalist society and global economic views. Our whole world revolves around money, and there is no escaping its influence on our decisions and even on how we see ourselves. It is the water we swim in! We often unconsciously place a value on things and on people based what they can produce or give to us in return. But Jesus calls us to see others and our lives through a different lens. We are to see that nothing that we have, or that we are, actually belongs to us or determines our worth. All that we have and all people belong to God, and we are simply called to be stewards, or caretakers, of these gifts.

A life of generosity is a life grounded in the faith that all that we have is a gift and opportunity to share God's love with others. At Zion, we have been using our resources over the past year to help our neighbors in need and to share the love of Christ together. As we keep our food shelf cupboard stocked with supplies to help keep our neighbors fed, clean, and warm, we participate in good stewardship. As we keep our building open for worship, community meetings (like AA, Alanon, elections), for faith education opportunities, service work, and fellowship activities, we participate in good stewardship. As we continue to give, each of us out of the gifts we have first received, we participate in good stewardship. Thank you for your ongoing practice of generosity as we continue our life together as God's people. What a joy and a blessing it is to be in community with you!

Church Council

Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, August 8th, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:00pm. Present were Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Sara Schubert McKone, Donna Meltz, Shannon Johnson and Lynn Rochon.

Devotions were given by Lynn. Next month will be Aine.

A motion was made by Sara and seconded by Donna to accept June's secretary report. Motion carried.

Treasurer Report: As of August 8th, our checking balance is \$606.39, the savings balance is \$10,039.15 and the mortgage is at \$37,070.47. Part of the savings balance is dedicated funds for the youth gathering (about \$3,400) and for the Afghanistan refugee fund (\$3,500). That means about \$3,139 is the church operating money. Donna and Aine will do a count tonight of the money that has come in this month. No count was done on Sunday since no service was held here at Zion, as there was a combined Superior ELCA service at Pilgrim. That money will be deposited tonight. We encourage people to continue to give what they are able to. The council will keep the congregation up-to-date via the weekly e-newsletter.

Pastors Report: The ELCA Youth gathering in New Orleans has been successfully traveled to and returned from along with a Service Learning Camp experience in Memphis. They will be sharing about their experience in worship on Sunday, August 25th. They still have more candy bars to sell. Profits from the sales will go towards the next gathering in 2027 in Minneapolis. We had a shared service on Sunday, August 4th at Pilgrim. We will be planning another service for this winter. Our ELCA Lutheran churches along with Faith Methodist (and possibly United Presbyterian) will be re-launching the United Campus Ministry this fall. We will be co-sponsoring a weekly gathering for college students with a dinner, worship service/bible study time, and study space hosted at Pilgrim Lutheran Church. There will be a rotation for the churches to provide a dinner, and Pastor Sarah is planning to be part of the worship/bible study team along with other pastors in Superior. We are going to be restarting our Parish Nursing ministry at Zion and calling it "Health & Wellness Ministry". Heidi Hillstrom-Maki will be leading this ministry and asking for other health professionals from our congregation to help her in offering health information and blood pressure checks on a regular basis. She will be training online this fall to help her learn more about best practices for this ministry. Pastor will be on vacation from Monday, August 12-Sunday, August 18th. She will be back in the office on Tuesday, August 20th.

Discipleship: VBS just wrapped up. 22 kids attended. There were 12 youth helpers, 5 adult leaders and a kitchen crew. Beth Arneson got a Thrivent grant of \$250 for supplies for sandwiches for the Food Shelf. Sunday School will start September 22nd, LOGOS will start September 18th and Adult Bible Study September 4th.

Worship and Music: No meeting this month.

A motion was made by Sara and seconded by Shannon to accept all reports as given. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business: Visioning ties into Projects that will be discussed in New Business.

New Business: There is \$42,975 left of the grant money given to us by the city. We have tried to get permission from them to use that money on new flooring in the Fellowship Hall, kitchen and up to the bathroom, new siding and a handicap accessible door. We are still waiting on them to respond.

Upcoming events:

Rummage sale – August 17th, Blessing of the back packs – September 8th Gods work, Our Hands – September 8th

We discussed continuing having one Sunday service after the summer schedule ends. It would be at 10am. At 9am would be education hour (Sunday School and adult education) with more fellowship after the service. Having one worship service would give more opportunities for people to serve and we wouldn't need to change times when just 1 service was needed. When LOGOS starts, there will be a praise worship service to include the whole congregation from 5pm – 5:30pm. A motion was made by Christel and seconded by Shannon to have 1 service at 10am starting September 1st. Motion carried. Pastor will write a letter to the congregation to communicate the time change of the worship service and to inform them about our finances. We got two pieces of mail Lynn wanted us to know about. The first was from a company that wants to inspect our stained glass window. We do not need that done. The other letter was an estimate from the snow removal company we used last year. She will give that letter to Paul Freer.

WFP received the Nobel Prize in Peace for 2020 for their efforts to combat hunger, contribute to peace in conflict areas, and for playing a leading role in stopping the use of hunger in the form of a weapon for war and conflict.


