# Church Council

Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, October 17th, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:05pm. Present were Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Pastor Sarah Gunderson, Sara Schubert McKone, Donna Meltz, Shannon Johnson, Don Anderson and Lynn Rochon.

Devotions were given by Sara. Next month will be Donna.

Vicky Holm was at the meeting to discuss 3 events she is planning. One is a Christmas dinner on Christmas Day from 1 – 3. She has a letter to give to businesses to get donations. She has another letter she will give to senior living and surrounding communities to let them know we are offering this at Zion. The second event she is planning is for a concert and dessert on Valentines Day. The third event is on April 4, 5 and 6<sup>th</sup>. It is an 8 character play called Don't Kick the Turkey. It is a comedy with a message.

A motion was made by Sara and seconded by Donna to accept September's secretary report. Motion carried.

**Treasurers Report**: The checking account balance is \$2,194.40, the savings account balance is \$5,050.16 and the mortgage is at \$35,784.09. We do not have enough money in the accounts to make the end of the month payroll. We discussed ways to let the congregation know how critical the situation is. We will discuss this issue more in new business.

**Pastors Report**: We have 3 young people preparing for their Affirmation of Baptism (and to be welcomed as adult members) on Sunday, October 27<sup>th</sup>. They are Katherine (Kate) Conlan, Trey Pedersen and Daniel Larson. A motion was made by Sarah and seconded by Aine to accept Kate, Trey and Daniel as new members of Zion. Motion carried. We ahoe about 13 people participating in our reading of Henri Nouwen's book With Open Hands. Some participants have been meeting weekly on Tuesdays either at church at 10am or on Zoom at 7pm. Our last meeting will be on October 29<sup>th</sup>. The book study has led to great discussions and relational ministry along with all the things we are learning about prayer. We will plant to have another book study this spring. This fall we made a shift in time and structure for worship on Sunday mornings with education at 9am (Sunday School & Adult education) and worship at 10am using a blended-style. I feel this has been going very well. We are at an average attendance of 45, and there has been a lot of positive feedback on the service. We have a small group of adults engaged in the weekly bible study, and Sunday school has been working on a puppet project to connect to worship on October 20<sup>th</sup>, along with using a new curriculum and incorporating fellowship time into their gathering. I think it is a great start to creating a positive education experience for all ages. This fall we also made a shift to make Wednesday evenings more open to the whole congregation. We have been doing 30-minute service with communion and youth leadership each week before dinner. We have mostly had people already connected to Logos attending, but I think our Wednesdays are a great place for us to continue to grow in our relational ministry with youth and adults. During Advent, we are looking at doing a Dinner Church experience that will have our worship/study/game/meal all happening around tables in the fellowship hall from 5:30-7pm. This will be an intentional inter-generational experience for the whole congregation to be a part of in December. United Campus Ministry dinners and worship started on September 22rd. Zion served a meal on September 29<sup>th</sup> (thanks to Vicky Holm & Owin Holm), and is scheduled for October 27<sup>th</sup> & November 17<sup>th</sup>. We are slowly building connections with students on campus and having good fellowship time with the other Lutheran churches in Superior along with a group from Faith Methodist. Next shared worship service will be an ecumenical Thanksgiving service on Sunday, November 24<sup>th</sup> at Pilgrim with dinner at 5:30 and service at 6:30pm, and then the Lutheran churches will be gathering on Sunday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 10am at Zion. Next meeting of the group for planning will be on Thursday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at 5pm a Zion. I will be attending a regional event in Marathon, WI for all first all pastors It goes form Sunday event (November 10<sup>th</sup>) to Tuesday afternoon (November 12<sup>th</sup>).

**Discipleship:** Sunday School has between 2 and 11 kids attending.

Worship and Music: Did not meet this month.

**Property**: Did not meet this month, however, they did sign a contract with the same snow plow company we used last year.

**Stewardship**: Tim is looking into using Vanco, which is a platform to make giving easier. They also are working on enhancing visual things in worship.

**WELCA**: The cooking sale will be December 14<sup>th</sup>. They are thinking of adding crafts to the cookie sale.

A motion was made by Shannon and seconded by Sara to accept all reports as given. Motion carried.

**New Business**: The new food shelf cabinet is broken. If you open the left door all the way, the shelves fall. We discussed ways to fix the problem. No decision made. We discussed our financial situation and how to inform the congregation about how dire the situation is. Our action plan:

- 1. Lynn will make an announcement this Sunday.
- 2. A communication will be sent to all members of the congregation. If we have email addresses, we will send an email, otherwise a letter will be sent.
- 3. Members of the Council and Stewardship will meet after church this Sunday.

A motion was made at 7:41pm by Donna and seconded by Shannon to adjourn. Motion carried.
