The Season of Epiphany

We celebrate the Day of Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup> in the Christian calendar. Some places in the world celebrate the day with festive gatherings and presents to honor the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus. For many, it is an even bigger day to celebrate than Christmas!

My favorite part of the Epiphany story is how the star showed up to guide the way to Jesus, and those that were paying careful attention, let their curiosity about the star lead them on a journey. This light that God places in the world creates a path and brings a connection for people near and far to find their way to the presence of Christ. These images are powerful ones for us that the whole season of Epiphany expands on and helps us to wonder about this light of Christ present in us and in others. It invites us to get curious and imagine where God

might be breaking into our lives with a call to seek and find Jesus in this world.

January 12<sup>th</sup> is Baptism of Our Lord Sunday. The gift of Jesus is always connected to the gift of Baptism for us. The grace and love that God pours out in the sacrament of Holy Baptism is a continuation of the gift of the incarnation of Jesus Christ. On the day of our baptism, we are proclaimed to be children of God and told to let our light so shine before others that they may see our good works and give glory to God in heaven (who is the source of all good gifts). We are invited to follow Jesus with all that we are and to join a community of believers who are seeking to do the same.

Each of the past few years, I have had star words available for us to help us in our following of Jesus in the new year. The gift of a star word is that you never know where or how God might use it to guide us in our faith journey. Sunday, January 19<sup>th</sup> will be Star Word Sunday, and you will be invited to receive a star with a special word written on it, and then will be blessed and encouraged to see where its light will lead you in the coming year.

## Church Council

Church Council Meeting Minutes for Thursday, November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024

The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Rochon at 6:03pm. Present were Christel Lewis, Aine Merrill, Margaret Sundet, Donna Meltz, Shannon Johnson, Don Anderson and Lynn Rochon.

Devotions were given by Donna. Next month will be Donna again.

A motion was made by Christel and seconded by Shannon to accept October's secretary report. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report: The checking account balance is \$26,625.36, the savings balance is \$2,550.16 and the mortgage is at \$35,137.28. Lynn will ask Greg to give us a copy of the check register again to review at the meeting. Pastors Report: Superior Churches/Shared Ministry: United Campus Ministry continues with weekly dinners planned until Dec. 15 (then UWS will be on break until end of January). We are planning to review how the fall went and make plans for winter/spring. Thanks to Vicky Holm who did the main coordinating for the Zion meal weeks! Paul Robinson and Bob & Kay Warner also assisted. Next shared worship service will be an ecumenical Thanksgiving service on Sunday, November 24th at Pilgrim with dinner at 5:30 and service at 6:30pm, and then the Lutheran churches will be gathering on Sunday, Feb. 23 at 10am at Zion with lunch to follow. Worship: After a busy fall with special days including Rally Sunday, Blessing of the Animals, Honoring Indigenous Peoples, Confirmation, Bible distribution, and All Saints, we have taken a little breath the last few weeks with worship as usual. The 10am service continues to have consistent attendance between 40-50 people. Our Wednesday praise service has around 20 people in attendance each week. During Advent we will have special themes on Sunday morning, and will be doing a Dinner Church model on Wednesdays. Christmas services have been set for 4pm and 10pm. A Blue Christmas service will be planned for Sun. Dec. 22nd at 7pm. We have a team of dedicated people who meet to plan monthly for worship and keep the weekly things happening (coordinating volunteers, running sound/camera), and people who serve on Altar Guild, who keep the sanctuary clean and decorated for the seasons, musicians who share their gifts, and lay leaders who read, pray, and serve faithfully. I am thankful for all them all! Discipleship: Adult bible study on Wednesday 1:30pm and Sundays 9am continues to have steady participation. Our book study on With Open Hands by Henri Nouwen this fall focused on prayer, and it led to deep conversations and connections. We will plan another book study for sometime this Spring. There has been interest in learning about the basics of the various world religions, and so I will be planning something in the new year. If there are other topics, let me know! It is a joy to continue to support the amazing Sunday School and Logos education ministry teams as well. We are blessed by their incredible work! Pastoral Care: I continue to try to visit monthly with our members in nursing homes or who are home bound, as well as checking in with those who have been hospitalized or had deaths in their families. Please continue to encourage people to reach out to me if they would like a visit. Vacation days planned for Monday, December 30-Saturday, January.

Tim Ingersoll was at the meeting to discuss the Vanco Giving product. He showed us examples of the tiles that can be added to such things like our website and Facebook page. Vanco shows the community and our church members what we are doing at Zion and gives a story about the different projects we need money for. It actively asks for giving. We discussed the product and features and how it will be connected to Shepherds Staff. Tim put together a timeline of how we can have it rolled out and have staff trained on it and be live in January. The council agreed to move forward with the project.

**Discipleship**: LOGOS is going well. The confirmed students are still attending. The Sunday School is starting to work on the Christmas program, which will be held on Sunday, December 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Worship and Music**: There will be 2 services on Christmas Eve. One at 4:00pm and the other at 10pm. There will also be a blue Christmas service on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, in the evening.

**Property**: They talked about the budget and they will put together a priority list of the things that need to be done around the church. They will be done as funds are available.

Stewardship: They are working on having a stewardship and giving emphasis in January.

**WELCA**: They talked about the cookie sale in December. They will have a sign up sheet out on Sunday and Paul made up posters. That poster is posted in local businesses and on our Facebook page.

A motion was made by Donna and seconded by Shannon to accept all reports as given. Motion carried.

**Unfinished Business**: The discussion for the annual meeting stewardship plan will be tabled until our December meeting.

**New Business**: We discussed the proposed 2025 budget. We settled on a budget that is a little less than a 2% increase from last year. We are still receiving checks for the Faith United Methodist Food Shelf. Pastor Sarah will talk to Linda Brow to have those checks returned to the giver for them to give the money directly to Faith United. A motion was made at 8:09pm by Donna and seconded by Shannon to adjourn. Motion carried,


